





# This guidebook is targeted at immigrants living in lisalmi.

The guidebook contains information which immigrants need when starting a life in a new country. The guidebook has information about housing, working, education, different services and recreational activities.

The guidebook also contains contact information for different authorities and officials.

The guidebook is published in Finnish, Russian and English. It is compiled by the Welcome to Northern Savo project in cooperation with local authorities and other partners. The guidebook for immigrants in Mikkeli, created by the employees of the South Savo Vocational College's project Pointti – Maahanmuuttajat työvoimaksi Etelä-Savossa, was used as a basis for creating this guidebook.

The Welcome to Northern Savo project is funded by ESF and it involves 11 municipalities in Northern Savo: Kuopio, Siilinjärvi, Varkaus, Iisalmi, Keitele, Kiuruvesi, Lapinlahti, Pielavesi, Sonkaiärvi, Varpaisjärvi and Vieremä. The project aims at improving and developing the services of different municipalities targeted at immigrants. One aim is to offer and develop multilingual counselling and information services for immigrants in Northern Savo. Multilingual counselling and information services are available in Kuopio, Varkaus and lisalmi and, if needed, in other municipalities, e.g. via telephone or e-mail. The project also offers help and support for employees of municipalities. e.g. by creating networks of people working with immigration matters, by producing and handing out materials that can be utilized in multicultural work. and by organising education. The project started in 2008 and it will last until the end of November 2011.

## 2. Moving to lisalmi

### 2.1 REGISTRATION AT THE **REGISTER OFFICE**

When you move to lisalmi, it is important to register at the Register Office (maistraatti) and submit a notification for the change of your address.


Register in the Finnish Population Information System at the local Register Office (Poliisitalo, Virrankatu 2). Fill in and sign the Registration of Foreigners form (ulkomaalaisen rekisteröintiilmoitus) and submit the Change of Address Notification (muuttoilmoitus).

After registration, you will be issued a personal identity number (henkilötunnus), which will be mailed to you. Personal identity number is important in Finland. You need it, e.g. at the health centre, Social Insurance Institution (Kansaneläkelaitos, KELA), bank, and for the payment of your salary to ensure that the salary is paid to the right person.

### Bring the following documents with you to the Register Office:

- 1. Passport
- 2. Residence permit (if you come outside the EU/ EEA area)
- 3. Other relevant documents and their official translations (the Apostille Certificate. apostille-todistus). For example, if you are married, you need to bring your marriage certificate. If you have children, you need to bring their birth certificates.

### 2.2 PERMITS

If a foreigner wishes to stay in Finland for more than 3 months, s/he needs a residence permit (oleskelulupa). Nordic Nationals. European Union (EU) nationals and nationals of Iceland, Liechtenstein. Norway and Switzerland do not need a residence permit.

EU nationals or EEA nationals may reside, work and practise a profession or study in Finland for 3 months without having to register their right of residency (oleskeluoikeus). The right of residency must be registered after 3 months at the police station.

The Police Licence Services (Poliisin Iupapalvelut, Poliisitalo, Virrankatu 2) take care of matters related to permits and licences. At the police station, you can also find out whether your driving licence (ajokortti) is valid in Finland.

### **2.3 KELA**

The Social Insurance Institution (Kansaneläkelaitos, KELA) handles social security matters in Finland. The social security system in Finland is based on residence in the country. Apart from some exceptions, people with permanent residence in Finland are entitled to the social security benefits by Kela.

Once you have been issued a personal identity number, visit the Social Insurance Institution office (KELA, Päiviönkatu 14) to find out whether you are entitled to the Finnish social security.

If you are entitled to the Finnish social security, KELA will send you your sickness insurance card, i.e. KELA card (sairausvakuutuskortti or KELA-kort-ti), by mail. The card is provided free of charge for everyone residing permanently in Finland. You will need your KELA card, e.g. at the health centre, hospital, pharmacy and when visiting a doctor or a dentist.

### 2.4 BANK ACCOUNT

In Finland, almost all payment transactions are managed through a bank. Therefore, you will need to have a bank account in Finland. A cash machine card/ATM card (pankkiautomaattikortti) can be added to your bank account which will enable you to draw money from a cash machine/ATM and pay your bills. According to the Finnish law, banks must be able to identify their customers. You can prove your identity with a valid passport or a permanent or temporary Finnish ID card (henkilökortti) issued by the Finnish police. Spouses can have a joint bank account. The holder of the bank account can also grant another individual permission to use the account with the account holder's written consent.

## The bank will need the following information for opening a bank account:

- name of the person opening the bank account and/or bank account holder
- personal identification documents (passport or identity card)
- · personal identity number
- · address and domicile in Finland

## 3.1 CHANGE OF ADDRESS NOTIFICATION

If you move from one place to another, you must submit a Change of Address Notification (*muutto-ilmoitus*) to the post (*the Post Office*, Satamakatu 8 A) or at www.muuttoilmoitus.fi. This way you can ensure that your mail continues to find you.

In Finland, people generally live in rented or owned houses. Homes for rent or sale can be found on the housing offices' web pages and through advertisements in local newspapers or estate agents' listings.

### 3.2 RENTED HOUSING

You can rent homes from the town, from estate agents and from private individuals. When you rent a home, always make a written tenancy agreement (vuokrasopimus). Tenancy agreement can be made for a fixed period (i.e. määräaikainen sopimus) or for the time being (i.e. toistaiseksi voimassa oleva sopimus). The amount of rent payable and the date on which it should be paid are stated in the tenancy agreement.

Your landlord/lady may also require you to pay a deposit for the apartment, which will be returned to your account when you move out, in case you have taken a proper care of the apartment and paid your rent on time.

### 3.3 PRIVATELY OWNED HOUSING

lisalmi has many estate agents (kiinteistövälittäjä or asunnonvälittäjä) that can help you find the right apartment if you are looking to buy one.

If you want to build a house, you can rent or buy land from the Town of lisalmi or from private individuals. You will get more information about building a house from the Technical Services (Tekninen virasto) of the Town of lisalmi.

### 3.4 IMPORTANT INFORMATION **ABOUT HOUSING**

The mover's list below has important information about things which you need to take care of when you move to a new apartment.

- You can get an electricity supply contract (sähkösopimus) by calling a power company and giving them your name and new address. You will find the contact information for power companies in lisalmi from below.
- · Residents have the responsibility to buy and change light bulbs and fuses.
- The tenancy agreement will state whether water bills (vesilasku) are included in the rent or whether they are payable separately each month.
- If you own a television, you will need a TV licence (TV-lupa). TV licences can be purchased from the Finnish Communications Regulatory Authority (Viestinävirasto). More information in English at www.tv-maksu.fi/en/index.html.
- · By Finnish law, every home must have a fire alarm (palohälvtin). The resident must make sure that the alarm works and batteries are changed approximately once a year. If the fire alarm is out of order, home insurance does not cover a fire.
- Home insurance (kotivakuutus) is provided by insurance companies. Insurance companies will help you to choose the kind of insurance that best meets your needs. Make sure that you know exactly what is covered by the home insurance.
- Taking care of the household appliances (e.g. refrigerator, freezer, cooker, cooker hood and washing machine) is the responsibility of residents.
- If you want to put up a satellite antenna, you will need permission from your real estate manager (isännöitsijä).
- Balconies are for the residents' recreational purposes only. Cooking or storing food on the balcony is forbidden.
- Household waste is delivered in closed-up bin liners into containers reserved for them.
  - ~ Toxic materials, electric waste and electronics are problem waste. It cannot be disposed of in the waste containers of the real estate.
  - ~ Organic waste bin (biojäteastia), which is brown or green, is for food waste. Plastic or other waste cannot be disposed of in it.



- Deliver only newspapers and paper ads into the paper container, not plastic or other waste.
- If household waste is left outside, it will attract birds and other animals that spread diseases. Therefore, household waste is always disposed of in the containers reserved for them.

### Communal areas for residents:

- When you sign an agreement with your real estate manager on the use of sauna, you will have the right to use it at a certain date and time (a so-called saunavuoro), and you will get a key for the sauna.
- You must make a reservation to use the laundry room.
- The storage facilities are reserved for belongings which are not needed daily.
- Cars must be parked in allocated areas only. You
  can sign an agreement on a parking place with
  your real estate manager.

You will find the Kodin turvaopas, a household safety guidebook, on the web pages of the Rescue Department of the Ministry of the Interior (Sisäasiainministeriön pelastusosasto) at http://turvaopas.pelastustoimi.fi/index.html. The guidebook contains information about, e.g. fire safety and the prevention of accidents. The guidebook is available only in Finnish.

Each estate or building usually has a house committee (talotoimikunta) which is connected to the board of the housing association (taloyhtiön hallitus). The house committee is a channel for communicating the residents' opinions and wishes. All residents should participate in the house committee meetings. Members of the committee are elected in the meetings and that way they have a say in matters concerning their own building. It is also possible to contact the house committee if housing-related problems occur.


In addition to rent, tenants must pay water and electricity bills (*vesi- ja sähkölasku*). Check whether the water bill is included in the rent. You must always make an electricity supply contract (*sähkösopimus*) for your apartment. You can request tenders from different power companies and choose the one that suits you the best. In lisalmi, you can make the electricity supply contract with, e.g. Savon Voima.



The nearest airport (lentokenttä), called Rissala, is located in Siilinjärvi. (Lentokentäntie 275, 70900 Toivala). Rissala is about 60 kilometres from lisalmi.



### **5.1 STUDYING FINNISH ON YOUR OWN**

Finnish language skills will help you to cope with life in Finland. You can study Finnish in many ways.

You can borrow Finnish language study books or cassettes from the lisalmi Town Library (*lisalmen kirjasto*, Kirkkopuistonkatu 9) and study on your own at home. The library also has computers that can be used free of charge for searching information and for studying.

### **5.2 FINNISH LANGUAGE COURSES**

The Community College of Iisalmi (*Iisalmen kansalaisopisto*, Kirkkopuistonkatu 9) organises Finnish language evening courses. Everyone can participate in these courses.

You can ask about the Finnish language courses organised by the **lisalmi unit of the Summer University of Kuopio** from the Summer University (Kuopion kesäyliopisto, Kirkkopuistonkatu 9).

If you are registered as a jobseeker at the Employment and Economic Development Office (Työ- ja elinkeinotoimisto), you have a right to participate in labour market (or labour policy) integration training (työvoimapoliittinen kotoutumiskoulutus). In the integration training, you will study the Finnish language and familiarize yourself with the Finnish society and working life. Integration trainings are free of charge for the participants and the number of weekly studying hours is 35. You can get more information on the integration training from the Employment and Economic Development Office (Karjalankatu 3).

### 6.1 SERVICES OF THE EMPLOYMENT AND ECONOMIC **DEVELOPMENT OFFICE**

6. Work

The lisalmi region Employment and Economic Development Office or TE office (Tvö- ja Elinkeinotoimisto, TE-toimisto, Karialankatu 3) offers information about study possibilities and places where you can look for a job. If a person is registered as a jobseeker at the Employment and Economic Development Office, s/he is entitled to an integration plan (kotoutumissuunnitelma), has an opportunity to receive personal counselling and participate in labour market training.

### Who can register as a jobseeker?

You can register as a jobseeker if your residence permit is:

- a permanent residence permit (pysyvä oleskelulupa P) or a long-term resident's residence permit (pitkään oleskelleen P-EY lupa)
- a continuous residence permit for gainful employment (ansiotvöhön myönnetty jatkuvaluonteinen A lupa) with no employerrelated restrictions (työnantajaa koskeva rajoite)
- a fixed-term temporary residence permit (määräaikainen tilapäinen B lupa), you have the right to be in gainful employment, and the permit does not contain any employer-related restrictions.

You will find the letter for your residence permit on the residence sticker in your passport.

Contact the Employment and Economic Development Office also when you have arrived in Finland from another EU country to look for work (a so-called three-month job seeking period). Bring also the forms (U2 or E303) which you received from your country of departure.

At the lisalmi Employment and Economic Development Office, service is available in English, Swedish and Spanish. It is also possible to get some service in German and French. If other languages are needed, the office will book an interpreter.



You will be registered at the Employment and Economic Development Office starting on your personal registration date. You will also be given a new appointment with your personal employment counsellor (työvoimaneuvoja).

### On your visit, bring with you:

- · official Finnish translations of your work and study certificates
- Finnish language course certificates and other certificates that might help you in finding a job

You have to check in with the Employment and Economic Development Office when required. Your personal employment counsellor will give you more information. Remember to notify the Employment and Economic Development Office immediately of any changes in your situation (e.g. illnesses, foreign travel, change of address). In addition, you can ask about the recognition of foreign qualifications in Finland from the Employment and Economic Development Office.

If you are registered as a jobseeker at the Employment and Economic Development Office, you have a right to participate in labour market (or labour policy) integration training (työvoimapoliittinen kotoutumiskoulutus). In the integration training, you will study the Finnish language and familiarize yourself with the Finnish society and working life.

Integration trainings are free of charge for the participants and the number of weekly studying hours is 35. You can get more information on the integration trainings in lisalmi from the Employment and Economic Development Office (Karialankatu 3).



Remember to open a bank account in order to get your salary! In Finland, salaries are paid to bank accounts, not in cash.



### 7.1 EDUCATION SYSTEM



In Finland, children are subject to compulsory education (oppivelvollisuus) which means that children of compulsory school age are required to participate in basic education where the scope of the syllabus is nine years. School meals and materials are provided free of charge in basic education.

Finnish citizens are subject to compulsory education from the age of 7 to the age of 16. Compulsory education also applies to foreign children permanently residing in Finland. Municipalities and local authorities are obliged to ensure that all children are able to attend school.

All children under school age living in the municipality have the right for day care (päivähoito). The objective of day care is to support the growth and development of children in close partnership with homes. In day care, children train such skills as working in a group. Day care also supports the development of the child's abilities through play, thus enhancing the child's Finnish language skills.

Day care is provided as part-time or full-time care depending on the family's needs. In lisalmi, day care is provided by municipal day care centres (kunnallinen päiväkoti), by group family day care centres (ryhmäperhepäiväkoti) and by family day care providers (perhepäivähoitaja). If parents have to work in the evenings or at weekends, it is also possible to arrange care during these times.

Employees of the day care and parents draw up an early childhood education and care and pre-primary education plan (*varhaiskasvatuksen ja esiopetuksen suunnitelma*) for the child. The implementation of this plan is observed and evaluated at least once a year.

Day care fees are determined by the parents' incomes in accordance with the national grounds. (Asiakasmaksulaki, 'client fees act'). Day care offers children free meals (breakfast, lunch, afternoon snack).

### 7.3 PRE-SCHOOL EDUCATION

Pre-school education (esiopetus) is one year of school-like, systematic education for 6-year-old children before compulsory education.

Pre-school education is arranged for all voluntary

six-year-old children. The objective of pre-school education is to prepare children for school. Pre-school education is free of charge.

Pre-school education is offered at the day care centres of lisalmi and in separate pre-school education teaching groups and combined classes.

You can enquire about a pre-school education place, as well as other day care places, from the Day Care Office and Administration Services.

### 7.4 BASIC EDUCATION

In Finland, children usually start comprehensive school (peruskoulu) in the August of the year they turn seven. All children under 16 years of age have the right for basic education. In lisalmi, basic education is arranged at 12 comprehensive schools. Children must be enrolled for basic education. Enrolment can be made personally at the school which parents want the child to attend to, over the phone for the school headmaster or the school office during office hours, or online by submitting an electronic registration form (in Finnish) at www. iisalmi.fi > Koulutus > Yleisimmät kysymykset > Koulunkäynnin aloittaminen.

### Instruction preparing for basic education

If the Finnish language skills of an immigrant child are poor, it is possible for the child to start school a year later on application. In this case, the child can continue at day care, or s/he can be offered instruction preparing for basic education (perusopetukseen valmistava opetus). Preparatory instruction lasts a school year and during that time, the pupil will be offered instruction in Finnish or Swedish language and in basic education subjects.

When the preparatory instruction is completed, the child will move on to a regular class.

In lisalmi, in addition to instruction preparing for basic education, immigrant children can be offered instruction in their own native language or some foreign language in order to maintain the child's language skills. Immigrant children can also be offered remedial instruction for immigrant children. ### 7.5 STUDYING AFTER **BASIC EDUCATION**

In the final grade (9th grade) of comprehensive school, pupils usually apply for secondary education. Pupils can apply for a place at vocational upper secondary schools (ammatillinen oppilaitos) or at general upper secondary schools (lukio) through the nationwide joint application system (yhteishaku) in spring. Adults can also study at general upper secondary schools and complete a vocational qualification at a vocational school.

If a young person does not know where s/he wants to study after comprehensive school, or if s/ he wants to improve the grades on her/his school leaving certificate, s/he can apply for a place at the additional 10th form education (10. luokka). The closest additional 10th form education unit to lisalmi is at Portaanpää opisto in Lapinlahti.

### 7.6 UPPER SECONDARY EDUCATION

Upper secondary education (toisen asteen koulutus) is offered by general upper secondary schools and vocational upper secondary schools. In upper secondary education, teaching and meals are free of charge, but students have to pay for the study books. Students apply to upper secondary education through the nationwide joint application system. The joint application process is executed twice a vear: in spring and in autumn. However. some school places can be applied for also during other times.

### 7.6.1 GENERAL UPPER SECONDARY **EDUCATION**

General upper secondary schools do not offer students qualifications for any occupation. The objective of general upper secondary education is to provide students with general and allround information. Towards the end of general upper secondary education, students take the matriculation examination (ylioppilastutkinto) which comprises of different tests (vlioppilaskirjoitukset). All those who have completed the basic education syllabus are eligible for general upper secondary

lisalmi has two general upper secondary schools (Haukiniemenkatu 12). At the Iisalmi Lyseo General Upper Secondary School (lisalmen lyseon lukio), instruction is arranged during day time, and at the Iisalmi Adult Secondary School (Iisalmen aikuislukio), in the evening.

### 7.6.2 VOCATIONAL UPPER SECONDARY EDUCATION AND TRAINING

lisalmi has two schools offering vocational upper secondary education and training: the Ylä-Savo Vocational College (Ylä-Savon ammattiopisto) and Savo Vocational College (Savon ammatti- ja aikuisopisto).

At the Ylä-Savo Vocational College (Asevelikatu 4 and Yrittäjäntie 23) both young people and adults may complete a vocational qualification. The Ylä-Savo Vocational College offers vocational upper secondary education and training (ammatillinen peruskoulutus), preparatory and rehabilitative education and training (valmentava ja kuntouttava koulutus ja ohjaus) and preparatory vocational education and training (ammatilliseen peruskoulutukseen ohjaava ja valmistava koulutus). However, the school does not offer preparatory vocational education and training targeted at immigrants.

Students can apply for a study place at the Ylä-Savo Vocational College through the joint application system or its supplementary application system (yhteishaun täydennyshaku). The applicant may also apply for a study place through the flexible selection procedure (joustava haku). In other words, education providers may ignore the order of scores in student admission for individual student-related reasons. The applicant must tick the box "Haen joustavassa haussa" ("I apply through the flexible selection procedure") in the electronic joint application form. The applicant must post the written application with all relevant appendices attached to it to the institution in question by the due date.

Vocational education and training can be completed in 3 years (120 credits). It is also possible to complete shorter studies. In addition, vocational education and training can be completed in the form of apprenticeship training. At the Ylä-Savo Vocational College, it is possible to complete vocational qualifications in various fields: Technology and Transport (e.g. builder); Tourism, Catering and Home Economics (e.g. cook); Natural Resources (e.g. animal attendant).

Applicants who do not have Finnish as their native language are asked to attend an interview and a language test at the Ylä-Savo Vocational College. The purpose is to ensure that the applicant is able to follow instruction taking place in Finnish.

Students apply for preparatory and rehabilitative education and training (valmentava ja kuntouttava koulutus ja ohjaus) and preparatory vocational education and training (ammatilliseen peruskoulutukseen ohjaava ja valmistava koulutus) with a special form which is returned to the Ylä-Savo Vocational College in written.

### Apprenticeship training

Apprenticeship training is a flexible, individual and practical form of education which is based on a fixed term employment contract between a student and an employer, on a valid employment relationship or on entrepreneurship. Instruction at the work place forms the central learning environment. This instruction is supplemented with theoretical studies at an institution. Qualifications are acquired through vocational skills demonstrations on the job.

It is possible to complete all vocational upper secondary qualifications (ammatillinen perustutkinto), further vocational qualifications (ammattitutkinto) and specialist vocational qualifications (erikoisammattitutkinto) in the form of apprenticeship training. With regard to vocational upper secondary qualifications, students must demonstrate the skills and knowledge required in working life. Further vocational qualifications require students to demonstrate vocational skills needed for work in a specific field, and specialist vocational qualifications require students to demonstrate skills in the most demanding tasks in the relevant field. If you are interested in apprenticeship training, you can start off by contacting the Apprenticeship Training Office (oppisopimustoimisto, Asevelikatu 4, tel. 017 272 5465), or by familiarizing yourself with the relevant web pages at www.ysao.fi/oppisopimus.

Adults have the possibility to complete approximately 50 different qualifications including vocational upper secondary qualifications, further vocational qualifications and specialist vocational qualifications at the Ylä-Savo Vocational College.

Adult education offers education in the fields of tourism, catering, natural resources, cleaning services, technology, transport and business. It is also possible to study and learn skills, such as computing or languages, on shorter courses.

At the Iisalmi unit of the Savo Vocational College (Savon ammatti- ja aikuisopisto, SAKKY, Asevelikatu 24) both young people and adults can complete vocational qualifications and other studies.

## The vocational education for young people offers educational opportunities in the fields of, e.g.

- Business and Administration (e.g. Vocational Qualification in Business and Administration) (Yhteiskuntatieteiden, liiketalouden ja hallinnon ala, merkonomi)
- Natural Sciences (e.g. Vocational Qualification in Natural Sciences) (Luonnontieteet, datanomi)

### 7.7 HIGHER EDUCATION

Higher education (korkea-asteen koulutus) is offered at polytechnics / universities of applied sciences (ammattikorkeakoulu) and at universities (yliopisto). A requirement for admission to higher education institutions is the completion of general or vocational upper secondary education, or a corresponding international or foreign qualification. It is possible to study at a university of applied sciences in lisalmi. However, lisalmi does not have a university. The closest university to lisalmi, the University of Eastern Finland, is located in Kuopio, around 80 kilometres from lisalmi.

At the Iisalmi campus of the Savonia University of Applied Sciences (Savonia-ammattikorkeakoulu), you can study to become a Bachelor of Agriculture and Forestry, a Registered nurse or a Bachelor of Social Services. Instruction takes place in Finnish. Requirement for admission is the completion of an entrance examination which is in Finnish.

Emergencies are urgent, danger situations where someone's life, health, property or the environment is threatened or in danger.

- explain what has happened and why you need urgent help
- answer the questions you are asked and follow the instructions you are given
- end the phone call only after you have been given a permission to do so

First aid treatment is provided in urgent matters 24 h a day at the hospital.

Services of the round the clock hospital emergency unit are reserved for patients who need urgent emergency care in situations where the care measures must be initiated immediately because of the seriousness of the situation. The hospital emergency unit takes care of patients who have, e.g. fallen suddenly and dangerously ill or have been hurt in an accident.



It is not possible to book an appointment for the hospital emergency unit. Patients arriving at the hospital emergency unit are treated according to the triage process.

In urgent and serious cases of disease, you can go directly to the lisalmi hospital emergency unit (lisalmen sairaalan ensiapu, Riistakatu 21 - 23, 74120 lisalmi).

### **8.4 WHEN YOU FALL ILL**

When you suddenly fall ill but do not need emergency care, if possible, call the health nurse at the health centre for phone counselling before arriving at the emergency unit.

The health nurse will estimate the need of care and guide you, e.g. to the emergency unit of the lisalmi health centre (terveysaseman päivystysvastaanotto, Meijerikatu 2, 74120 lisalmi).

The emergency unit of the lisalmi health centre is meant for patients who have fallen ill suddenly but do not need instant emergency care or observation. Symptoms and problems treated at the emergency unit of the lisalmi health centre include, e.g. ear infections, cold, cough, eye infections, back pain, allergies, rashes, sexually transmitted diseases and gynaecological symptoms.

### Client fees

Visiting the emergency unit of the health centre is free of charge for under 18-year-old Finnish citizens. Adults are charged client fees. Visiting the health nurse is free of charge.

### Acute care team

The acute care team (akuuttityöryhmä) consists of a doctor, a psychologist, three psychiatric nurses and a part-time service counsellor. The team works at the Kolionvirta hospital.

The purpose of the acute care team is to respond to the need of psychological help when the help is needed within 1 to 7 days (urgency category I, kiireellisyysluokka I). This includes different acute psychological crises that threaten the mental health or normal functions.

The acute care team can be reached 24 h a day on 040 761 4400.

## Mental health and alcohol and drug treatment unit

Alcohol and drug treatment unit (päihdeyksikkö) is a ward with 10 beds which offers rehabilitative services for patients in the area of Ylä-Savo municipal board. Treatment aims at improving the patient's psychological and physical well-being, identifying their life situations and planning follow-up treatment. Patients can be admitted to the care without a doctor's referral.

Social services on duty (sosiaalipäivystys) give help in situations where urgent social service measures are required. These situations may include domestic violence, the need of child welfare measures, or a suddenly decreasing condition of an elderly person.

### 10.3 LEGAL AID OFFICE

The Legal Aid Office (oikeusaputoimisto) provides impartial legal aid in matters concerning, e.g. divorce, crime or violence. Ask, whether you are entitled to legal aid free of charge.

### 11.1 YOUTH SERVICES

In Finland, municipalities are responsible for organising youth work. Youth work is organised by professional workers and it is executed by municipalities, associations, organisations and parishes. Youth work aims at supporting the growth and independence of young people, promoting their active citizenship and social empowerment, as well as improving their growing and living conditions.

In lisalmi, the municipal youth work is organised by the Leisure Services Centre (*vapaa-aikapalvelukes-kus*). The youth work activities are mainly targeted at over 13-year-olds.

### lisalmi has three youth centres:

- The youth house of lisalmi (lisalmen nuorisotalo) is located in the city centre at Kirkkopuistonkatu 25 (74100 lisalmi). The youth house is called Nuokkari. Nuokkari is open between 3 and 8 p.m. from Monday to Thursday. Band rehearsal rooms, which bands may rent, are located downstairs. The youth leader of the youth house can give you more information, tel. 040 8302 666.
- The Kangaslampi youth cabin (Kangaslammin nuorisotupa) is located next to the Kangaslampi school at Paiukatu 1 (74130 lisalmi).
- In Peltosalmi, the youth work organises activities at the premises of the parish at Asuntopolku 4 (74510 Peltosalmi).

The youth work of the Town of lisalmi also organises other activities, such as band nights, discos, trips and other events.


